Pracsys was commissioned by the City of Cockburn to conduct a cost benefit and financial analysis relating to the relocation of the Cockburn Bowling and Recreation Club (CBRC) and development of the new multi-purpose Cockburn Bowling and Recreation Facility (CBRF) in Yangebup. The City of Cockburn is seeking funding from the

National Stronger Regions Fund (NSRF) to relocate the CBRC to the new Yangebup location. This will enable the club to improve community accessibility, capture future population growth benefits and achieve the strategic goals for Bowls WA.

Pracsys provided analytic support to provide an evidence base around two key technical elements of the NSRF application:

- Estimation of the socio-economic impact of the proposed recreation club's relocation
- Assessment of the sustainability of the proposed recreation club's business model

Outcomes: The results of the economic analysis indicated that the construction of the project is likely to have significant economic and social benefits for the City of Cockburn and the South West Metropolitan Region.

The City of Cockburn was successful in securing \$4,556,287 from the NSRF in support of this project.
